Picture this: Eve sitting under a tree in the Garden of Eden eating a lovely leafy salad. Adam walks up to her and both clad in nothing but a fig leaf he says "I don't want to ruin your lunch but you are eating my dirty laundry! Sometimes the most normal act can create a unpleasant result. At the Jewish cemetery near Blue Star Highway it has become necessary to do some normal maintenance. Many years of stone piles brought to gravesides have accumulated to the point of falling off the grave markers and getting in the lawn mower. These stones are nicking the grave markers and are dangerous to the people operating the weed eater and the

mower. We have checked with various Rabbis and are informed that there is no rule against removal of these stones. With the understanding of gravesite owners, we will remove the memorial stones and put them back in the urn. However, anyone who objects to this cleanup can e-mail or write the FHC board, requesting that their site not be touched. We will wait one month to give response time to all.

Many members have asked about the development of the Save a Lot property north of the Shul. The two bars that a developer wanted to put there is a dead deal. However, the property is certain to be developed and we will monitor and scrutinize all proposals that cross the South Haven Planning Commission desk. There are several options that are being discussed, including another version of the original brewpub plan. It is too early to determine the viability of such plans. Your comments to City Hall supporting the integrity of our synagogue would be helpful. Also, support from other faith groups, in terms of written notes to City Hall, is welcome.

Restoration

Our Shul renovation is 90% completed and looks great! We have come a long way since the small kitchen remodeling a few years ago started a major renovation project, and all with your help. We hope everyone is proud of the job that has been done by our tireless board and generous benefactors.

Everyone is looking forward to the

weekend of July 17, 18, 19, and the dedication of the Ben and Harriett Teitel Hall. Friday night will be a Conservative service starting at 8 pm. followed by an Oneg Shabbat, all led by our Rabbi Alan Cohen.
