Spiritual Vorts from Rabbi Alan Cohen

Rabbi Joseph Telushkin's "A Code of Jewish Ethics" p. 151

"The Rabbis teach that God created repentance even before He created the world (Genesis Rabbah 1:4). God knew that he would endow human beings with free will, which they would sometimes misuse. Thus, God needed to provide humankind with a way to atone for and correct wrongful behavior. Without a process such as teshuvah (repentance), even good people would be overwhelmed by guilt, both toward God, Whose laws they had broken, and toward those whom they had hurt."
